The Smead Family moved from Orange County in March 2021 to enjoy the rural aspects of The Farm Community. They like the family atmosphere the community has to offer. It is very quiet compared to Orange County with much more interaction.

Since purchasing the home, many upgrades have been completed. All appliances have been upgraded, and new ductwork was installed with the additional air conditioning unit. The backyard was completely overhauled with plants, a new drip system, a 10' x 40' aluminum patio cover, and artificial turf.

The side fence was upgraded to white vinyl and relocated to gain more side yard. The front yard rock was removed and replaced with rubber mulch, a new drip system installed along with planted palm trees and agave plants. The homeowners installed a front yard garden wall with solar lights. The exterior of the house was painted to a more modern color (graphite grey). Solar panels and new laminate flooring was also completed.

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SAY "HELLO" TO THE NEW FERT CHAIRPERSON! By Susie Watters, FERT Secretary

The Farm Emergency Response Team (FERT) welcomes our new Chairperson, Jeremy Bechtold! He comes to us with an extensive background in law enforcement and emergency services training.

After high school, Jeremy joined the USAF Reserve as a crew chief at March AFB where he was trained in HAZMAT as a first responder, operations level. He then became a LASD Deputy Sheriff working in the jail system. After a few years, he transferred to Corona PD where he received training in: Prevention and Response to Suicide and Terrorist Bombings, Mobile Command Post and Triage, Response to School/Community Violence Course, Tactical Rifle Course, Police Service Dog Certified Agitator, and became a Police Star Recipient recognized by the California State Senate & US Congress. Jeremy then worked at the Disneyland Resort as a security officer where he was trained as a first responder for various incidents.

His hobbies include HAM radio, where he holds a General Class License: K6TXN. Jeremy also has 33 hours logged in the Robinson R-22 helicopter with three hours of solo. He is currently pursuing a license certification in gyroplanes. He enjoys riding his Yamaha Star Venture with his wife, Erica, and rides a Suzuki DR200 in the hills around The Farm.

HOW-TO: TREAT AN INSECT STING/BITE By Sarah O'Brien, Bookkeeper

For most of us, summer means getting outside and exploring. Whichever pursuit you find yourself undertaking, being safe and prepared is just as important as having fun!

First and foremost is prevention! Bug spray is the number one suggestion from the American Association of Dermatology (AAD), followed by appropriate clothing, bed nets when sleeping outdoors, and to always heed travel warnings about outbreaks in the area you are heading to.

In the event of a bug bite or sting, the AAD has a few different procedures based on the type of insect that has gotten to you:

For a bee sting: -Stay Calm; -To remove the stinger, scrape over it with your fingernail a something solid like a credit card or piece of gauze (you should not use tweezers for this because it can release more venom into the body affected); - Wash with soap and water; -Apply a cold pack to reduce swelling. If the spot is painful, take a painkiller like ibuprofen or acetaminophen.

For a tick bite: -Use tweezers to remove the tick; -Pull upward with steady, even pressure and avoid twisting, squeezing, or crushing the tick; -Dispose of the tick by sealing it in a bag, alcohol submersion, or wrap tightly in tape (if you want to save the tick to be tested in case you observe adverse symptoms, keep it in a sealed jar); -Clean bite area with soap and water. Ticks are most active April-September and are found in heavily wooded areas and bushy areas. To prevent a tick bite, the AAD suggests that you walk in the center of trails and use bug spray with at least 20-30% DEET in it. Always examine your skin, hot spots, pets, and children after your adventure. If you are unable to avoid the bushes and long foliage, wear long pants and long sleeve shirts, pull your socks up over your pants and tuck in your shirt to help prevent ticks from being able to climb onto your skin.

Having fun this summer doesn't have to be a pain, we just need to remember to be safe and prepared for whatever gets "tossed" our way!


















































Do you love & care for your neighbors? Be a FERT Block Captain.

FERT stands for Farm Emergency Response Team.

The FERT committee consists of a small group of volunteers who are Farm residents just like you. We are organizing Block Captains who will be responsible for communicating with 20-40 homes in their neighborhood to help them prepare for a disaster (fire, earthquake, landslide, flood, etc.). Before the emergency, Block Captains will be responsible for identifying high risk neighbors (bed-ridden, on oxygen, disabled, etc).

In the event of an emergency, they will check on neighbors in their area and report fire, property damage, who is hurt and who needs help. Block Captains will take CERT training and be CPR, AED & First Aid trained.

FERT has put together a comprehensive plan for how to best care for our Community in the event of an emergency. They also participate in quarterly drills to hone their skills.

Those that have a plot and are using it may be asked in the future to move to another plot, this is to make room for more RV spaces.

We want make sure that everyone that wants a Garden plot and an RV space can have one.



Architectural Control Committee Message

Any architectural changes or improvements to the exterior of your property require approval from ACC before work can be initiated. All Architectural Change applications must be submitted to The Farm office by Thursday, September 1st.

3rd Quarter Evaluation

The ACC Committee and Staff have started the 3rd Quarter ACC evaluations. If you received a 2-week courtesy letter, be sure to take care of any violations before it goes to a possible fine.

If you do not understand the letter or need to request an extension, call the Farm Barn office at 951-244-3719.

Limit Fire Hazards

ACC Rule – Section 6.6 – Weed Abatement

Vegetation that is flammable and endangers the public safety by creating a fire hazard including but not limited to seasonal and recurrent weeds, stubble, brush, dry leaves, and tumbleweeds must be kept cleared (disked or removed) away from all structures for a distance of 100 feet or as applicable depending on lot size.

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
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

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
