

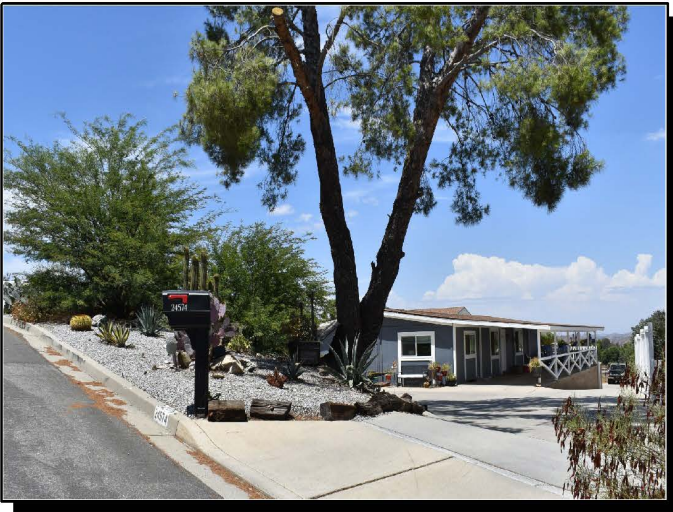

MONEY AND WATER SAVING PLANTS

Chrysactinia a southwest native

Common name: Damianita

Here are some great highlights about this easy-care, California native plant:

Growth: Max. 2 feet tall, grows fairly slowly.

Color: Bursts with very bright small yellow flowers in Spring and Fall and has small dark green foliage. It takes a break for the hot Summer.

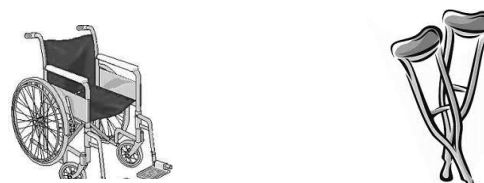
Water: It is a very tough plant and needs very little water (for example I planted a group of nine last year and have only watered them 2 x in July for ½ minute per plant). It has never been hooked up to irrigation and they are thriving! (of course, I do water them once in awhile with the house).

Soil: It is tolerant of many types of soils, but like any other plant, it needs good drainage.

Pruning/cutting: It can be sheared in early Spring, according to the Western Garden book, but I have found that in the first 7-8 years it needs no pruning.

This species is the epitome of a drought tolerant plant.

It is available at "Tree of Life Nursery" or any other local Native Plant Nursery. Also Louie's has a nice section of CA native plants. Another good source of information to learn about California Native plants is by contacting the California Native Plant Society at www.cnps.org. Phone (916) 447-2677. Thanks for reading, Dave.

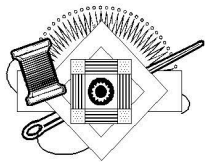

Why is the American Flag at Half-Staff?

Recently, you may have seen our flags around the Farm at half-staff and wondered "why?". On August 3, 2022, Illinois Representative Jackie Walorski died in a car crash. As befitting a member of Congress, President Biden ordered flags at all government buildings, naval vessels, and bases to be lowered to half-staff for the rest of the day on August 3rd until the end of the day on August 4th. So why is the flag flown at half-staff, are we required to do so, for what do we lower it, and for how long?

Without the specifics of a tragedy at hand, when seeing the flag at half-staff, one can safely assume that the nation is in mourning. The symbolism behind the half-staff flag is that by lowering the flag, we are making room for the invisible death flag to fly above Old Glory. This tradition of lowering the flag to half-mast dates to 1612 when a British ship made port in Canada with her captain dead. The policies regarding appropriate times were not formally regulated by policy until March 1, 1954 when President Dwight Eisenhower signed an executive order/proclamation to manage half-staff procedures.

While U.S. government buildings, schools, and bases are required to lower their flags when an event transpires, privately-owned flags are not required to follow suit but may elect to do so as a sign of respect. This show of respect is the reason that the Farm Property Owners Association aims to follow calls to fly our American flags at half-staff.

Below you will find a chart of how long to fly the American flag at half-staff and for what reasons outside of recognized flag-flying holidays:

<u>Reason</u>	<u>How Long at Half-Staff</u>
Death of a president or former president	30 Days
Death of a vice-president, the chief justice or a retired chief justice of the United States Supreme Court (USSC), or the Speaker of the House of Representatives (HOR)	10 Days
Death of an associate justice of USSC, a member of the Cabinet, former vice president, president pro tempore of the Senate, majority leader of the Senate, minority leader of the Senate, majority leader of the HOR, or minority leader of the HOR	From day of death until interment
Death of U.S. senator, representative, territorial delegate, or the resident commissioner from the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico	Day of death and day after; includes all federal facilities within the individual's constituency
Death of the governor of a state, territory, or possession	Day of death until interment at all federal facilities in the individual's constituency
President may order the flag to be at half-staff upon the death of other officials, former and current, or foreign dignitaries; or after other tragic events	To be determined by the President

There are also a few days throughout the year that the flag is to be flown at half-staff:

- May 15th for Peace Officers Memorial Day (half-staff all day)
- Last Monday in May for Memorial Day (half-staff until noon)
- September 11th for Patriot Day (half-staff all day)
- First Sunday in October for Fire Prevention Week and Fallen Firefighters (half-staff all day)
- December 7th for Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day (half-staff all day)

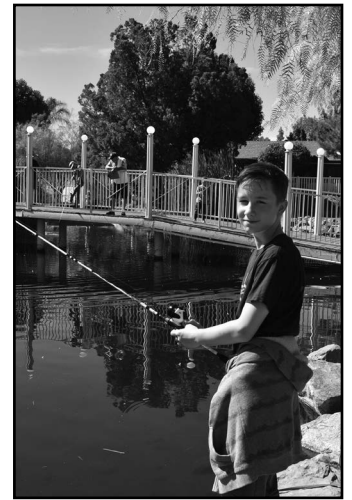
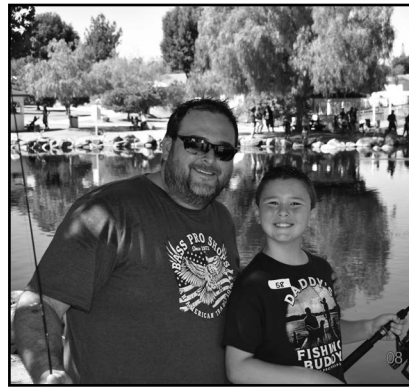

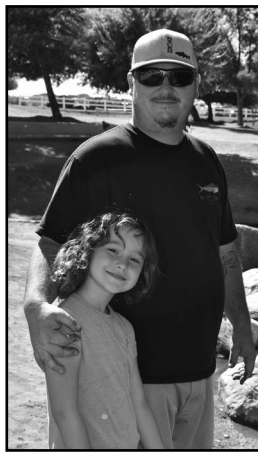

Kids' Fishing Derby Saturday, August 6th





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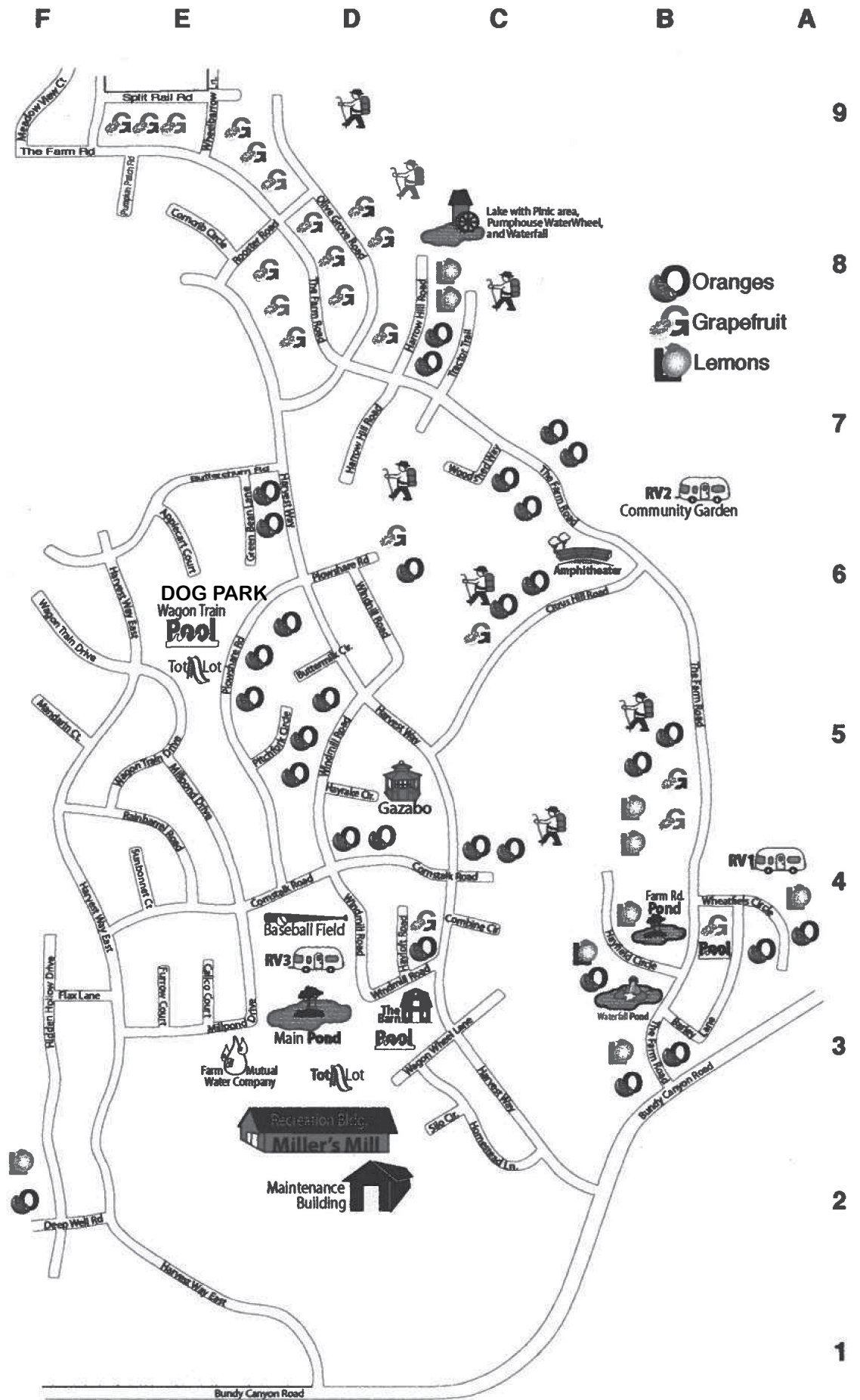
