Board of Directors' Message

Hello Farm Residents,

Remember assessments are \$77 beginning in January. If you are on Automtic Clearing House (ACH) with the association, you're automatically set. If you are using Bill Pay with your bank, you will need to remember to change the payment amount. Please call the Farm POA at 951-244-3719 if you are not sure what option you are using to pay the assessments. Some residents are still paying the old amount and will be subject to suspension of Farm amenities if the balance remains unpaid.

Get out your swimming trunks and bathing suits, because Wednesday, March 1st is the first day that the Farm Barn pool heater is turned on. Tenants will need to ensure there is a tenant notification form on file completed by the homeowner. This applies to those that have NOT already gone through the process. 

We bring our machines and have a great set up at Millers' Mill. We would love to increase our group. So stop by and check us out.




EXERCISE GROUP

In 95% of all emergencies, the victim or bystander provides the FIRST immediate assistance on the scene. Would you know what to do?

Be a FERT Block Captain.

FERT stands for Farm Emergency Response Team.

The FERT committee consists of a small group of volunteers who are Farm residents, just like you. We are organizing Block Captains who will be responsible for communicating with 20-40 homes in their neighborhood to help them prepare for a disaster (fire, earthquake, landslide, flood, etc.). Before the emergency, Block Captains will be responsible for identifying high risk neighbors (bed-ridden, on oxygen, disabled)

In the event of an emergency, they will check on neighbors in their area and report fire, property damage, who is hurt and who needs help.

Block Captains will take CERT training and be CPR, AED & First Aid trained.

FERT has put together a comprehensive plan for how to best care for our Farm Community in the event of an emergency.

They also participate in quarterly drills to hone their skills.

HOW-TO: IDENTIFY AND TREAT SHOCK

This month, I'd like to introduce you to a condition that is very serious and while not as common in general first-aid cases, it is still an important one to familiarize yourself with: Shock.

There are 5 recognized types of shock in the medical field: Cardiogenic (due to heart problems), Hypovolemic (caused by too little blood volume), Anaphylactic (caused by allergic reactions), Septic (due to infections), and Neurogenic (caused by damage to the nervous system). You are more likely to know of anaphylactic shock, as it is a very serious allergic reaction in people whom usually are very careful about their allergies. (ie. Seafood allergies, nut allergies, etc.)

Shock can occur from a few different incidents: trauma, heatstroke, blood loss, an allergic reaction, severe infection, poisoning, severe burns, or etc.

The main issue behind shock is that the organs aren't getting enough blood or, more importantly, oxygen. When this is sustained over a certain period of time, it can lead to permanent organ damage or even death.

Symptoms of shock commonly present as cool, clammy skin, pale or ashen skin, a bluish tings on the fingernails or the lips (gray with dark complexions), a rapid but weak pulse, rapid and shallow breathing, nausea or vomiting, enlarged pupils, dizziness or fainting, and weakness of fatigue. A change in mental status or behavior such as increasing anxiousness, agitation, or confusion is also a symptom that can present with shock.

It is important to immediately call 911 when shock is suspected. Lay the victim down, and elevate their legs and feet slightly, unless this were to cause them further harm, do not raise the victim's head. Administer CPR if there are no signs of life. Loosen tight clothing such as belts and jewelry and cover the person with a blanket to prevent chilling. Do not let the victim eat or drink anything. If the victim is bleeding, apply pressure over the area with a towel or sheet. If the victim vomits or begins bleeding from the mouth, and no spinal injury is suspected, turn them onto a side to prevent choking.
