The Farm Barn library is accepting donations. Any duplicate books will be donated to the Mission Trail library. Please no magazines or encyclopedias.





Elizabeth loved trees; their cooling shade, and environmental benefits they provide. She brought home seeds and saplings; planting trees in El Cajon, Murrieta, Aberdeen, and at her home here at the Farm. During her illness, she told us that she would like to donate a park bench, to be placed under the shade of a tree at the Farm, for the community to enjoy.

Elizabeth moved to the Farm in 2004 after retiring from Kaiser in San Diego, where she spent her career as a Registered Nurse in labor & delivery. The Farm was in a great location, close to family, and offered a perfect home base for the many years of good times ahead. She loved ballroom dancing; road trips all over the US in her van; camping; sewing; beading; big family gatherings; swimming; volunteering at the YMCA; adventures with her dogs Nellie, and Bonnie; gardening; walking the trails at the Farm; restoring homes in The Pacific Northwest; and enjoying the summers at her home in Aberdeen, WA.

With a bright smile, Elizabeth was loving, generous, and a good steward. She made hundreds of hand-stitched blankets for cancer patients and hospitalized babies; prepared and distributed brown-bag lunches to homeless people; provided financial assistance for family and friends in need; repurposed and recycled hospital plastics; and contributed to the many charitable causes she was passionate about.

She battled malignant melanoma for many years, and won!!! Cancer-free, she embraced the victory. But sadly, and unexpectedly, she lost her ability to walk last year, and was eventually diagnosed with ALS. In July 2022, with her family by her side, she passed away. Elizabeth is survived by her sister and husband, Judy and Hank Bernard; sister-in-law Patricia Allen; and Vinh and Duong Ngo. Her three daughters and their husbands, Tamara and Reggie, Michelle and Jeff, Jennifer and Curt, and son Rick; her grandchildren, Bethany, Jasmine, Jakob, Janessa, and Weston; six great grandchildren; and seven nieces and nephews; and her beloved canine companion, Bonnie.

This March, we celebrated what would have been her 80th birthday.

The family is grateful to the Farm POA for receiving her gift to the community: A park bench, made from recycled materials, placed under the California pepper trees.

OUTDOOR WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

Even though we use water every day, it's easy to take it for granted. Just imagine how you would function without clean water. It's everyone's responsibility to conserve and protect water resources. The decisions and actions you make today truly affect our water resources for the future. The following suggestions will help you get in the habit of saving water in the great outdoors:

- Get a rain gauge to measure rainfall. One inch of rain per week is generally sufficient for lawns and gardens. Supplement only when rainfall is inadequate.
- Use mulch around landscape plantings. Mulch will help eliminate weeds and hold moisture in the soil.
- Select hardy plants that don't need much water. Native plants that are well adapted to your climate and soils will survive well without supplemental watering.
- Water during the cool part of the day to avoid rapid evaporation.
- Raise the mowing heights on your lawn mower. This promotes healthier grass that can better survive dry periods.
- When watering is necessary, water slowly and thoroughly. If you notice puddles or runoff, turn water off and wait for water to soak in. Also be sure your sprinkler puts water where you need it—not on driveways or sidewalks.
- Wash cars efficiently. First give the car a quick rinse, and then turn the water off. Wash one section of the car at a time and rinse that section quickly. Turn the water off each time.
