# Board of Directors' Message

Hello Farm Residents.

At the Open Meeting on Thursday, April 13th, the Board of Directors voted to heat Pool 1 and Pool 3 a month earlier than expected. Pool 1 has an issue with the spa skimmer leaking. Plans are in the works to have this fixed as soon as possible. Maintenance has been painting, installing new benches, and giving the pool area an upgraded face-lift. The roof on the gazebo was also repaired.

The Pool 2 heating equipment has failed. While we work to have the warranty on the equipment honored we expect to have Pool 2 heated again very soon. We hope to have all the pools open and heated before the beginning of the month.

Also at the meeting, the park at Harrow Hill was discussed. Maintenance will clean out the mud and fill it back up with water so that the water wheel is functioning. Discussion will be had on what needs to happen to stop the mud from entering the ponds.

We would like to thank the residents and the Girl Scout Troop 2501 for attending the April Open Meeting. The Girl Scout Troop proposed little libraries in the Farm for two locations. The Board approved both locations. We look forward to seeing the little library at the Farm Barn and at Millers' Mill.

The Farm Barn will be closed in observance of Memorial Day on Monday, May 29th.

# WHAT ARE THE RESERVES? A LOOK AT THE FANCY TERMS WE USE.

A refresh is sometimes needed for all of us to get a recap of what all those fancy words mean in the yearly budget packet or the document package you received when you bought your home.

This article will cover a few subjects within the Reserves topic itself: Useful Life, Depreciation, Individual Homeowners Contributions, and Percent Funded.

- *Useful Life* = The estimated number of time (years) that an asset will be useful. This is without any improvements, repairs, and/or overhauls. At the end of an asset's Useful Life, it is expected to be replaced entirely, or completely overhauled. This is not always the case, as assets can continually be reviewed for actual wear and tear, versus the initial assessment. [i.e. An asphalt shingle/composition roof's approximate Useful Life is 20 years.]
- **Depreciation** = This is a percentage or monetary amount that an asset will lose in its value over the course of its useful life. The first few increments of time (usually years), the percentage/monetary amount will be small, this is a new asset after all. Further on in the asset's useful life, it will start depreciating at a higher percentage/monetary amount. [i.e. From the moment your new roof is installed, it starts depreciating. Typically, the first few years are a depreciation of 5% per year if no damage has occurred and the wear on the roof has been typical (for instance, snowpack on the roof didn't become an issue suddenly).]
- Individual Homeowner's Contributions = This is a dollar amount that is allocated to the Reserves account from the assessment that you pay every month. The dollar amount is based on the percentage recommended by the Reserve Study Professionals when they complete their Reserve Study every fall. That percentage is how much of the annual budget that should be put into the Reserves account based on the estimated depreciation of all the assets in the association expected for the year. [i.e. You know that after the Useful Life of your roof is up, you will need to replace it. So, you have been putting that 5% depreciation monetary amount in a savings account every year in preparation for that big expense. Now, you won't have to come up with the entire amount all at once, this is your personal Reserves account in a sense.]
- *Percent Funded* = This is a ratio, at a certain point in time in the fiscal year, of the actual Reserve balance to the Fully Funded balance, and it is expressed as a percentage. "Percent funded is calculated by dividing the current reserve fund balance by the fully funded balance." This percentage can go up and down over the years based on the need for pulling from the Reserves to repair (and in turn, extend the Useful Life of) community assets.

So how does all this tie into the Reserves? The useful life of each asset is calculated, its measure of yearly depreciation is calculated, this is all divided by the number of properties within the association, and then this monetary amount is deducted from the total assessment amount for the year and put into the Reserves account, changing the percent funded based on the Reserve Study's estimates for the year.

I hope this was helpful to you in understanding some parts of how the Reserves work for the Farm Property Owners Association. If you have any questions, please feel free to call the office during business hours at (951)-244-3719.

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
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
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
