

ALOHA ALOE By: Sarah O'Brien, Bookkeeper

There's a lot to be said about the Aloe plant, most important on our minds may be its drought-tolerant nature. If you're trying to figure out how to keep some green in your landscape without breaking the bank, Aloe is here to the rescue! (In more ways than one.)

This plant has many uses, but I know my top use is for sunburns. I simply cut off part of a leaf and squeeze it onto a sunburn. You can also slice it down the edge to open it up and put the gel over a larger area, leaving the other side of the leaf on. Then wrap some gauze around it to secure, and voila! Burn and mosquito bite care in a pinch.

Fresh aloe is a little sticky and has a slight yellow tint to it, that's okay! Just as long as it is clear and not cloudy, you're good to go. Aloe is a great choice for landscape in this area because it is drought-tolerant (can often go longer than a week without watering), beautiful, multi-useful, and does not have any spines to prick you! (Can you tell I'm not a fan of cacti?)

INFORMATION: Terry Leonardi and Clarice Ahner will start the Welcome visits.

INFORMATION: The developer of the section of Harvest Way East at Bundy Canyon requested the association take responsibility for maintaining the road and clearing illegal dumping. The Board has responded to the developer and the City of Wildomar. The Farm POA will not take responsibility for maintaining the developer's property.

INFORMATION: The ACC May House of the Month photo and certificate was shown for 34521 The Farm Road. The Martinez Family shows pride in ownership of their Farm property.

INFORMATION: The treasurer's report was read. The operating account total was \$236,990.55 with the reserve account at \$387.252.53. Eight properties transferred ownership. The reserve spending total for April was \$653.53 with the total for the year at \$57,578. Ninety-three percent of homeowners paid their April assessments.

MOTIONED: ES/ML: To approve a lien according to Section 5705 of the Civil Code against parcel number 362-320-002, the Association authorizes Richardson Ober LLC to place a lien to recover the delinquent amounts and any late fees, interest charges, and other collection-related amounts. M/C

MOTIONED: ES/PB: To approve a lien according to Section 5705 of the Civil Code against parcel number 362-463-003, the Association authorizes Richardson Ober LLC to place a lien to recover the delinquent amounts and any late fees, interest charges, and other collection-related amounts. M/C

MOTIONED: ES/EM: To approve a lien according to Section 5705 of the Civil Code against parcel number 362-630-012, the Association authorizes Richardson Ober LLC to place a lien to recover the delinquent amounts and any late fees, interest charges, and other collection-related amounts. M/C

INFORMATION: The maintenance report was reviewed. Weed abatement is the main focus of the maintenance team. The Cal Fire request for specific parcels is about 50% completed. The remaining 50% will be completed in two weeks. Once these are completed, the maintenance team will be working on the smaller parcels within The Farm.

INFORMATION: The Harrow Hill Water Wheel has been drained, and cleaned after the sets of rain. It has been filled with water and is back functioning. Maintenance also cleared part of the area to stop additional mud and debris from filling the water wheel.

DIRECTOR REPORT

President Dave Kentish - FERT Committee Liaison

Dave announced FERT had their drill last Saturday to help establish the communication plans for an emergency. The next Blood Drive is planned for Saturday, June 10th from 9 am to 2 pm. The last blood drive of the year will be held on Saturday, October 14th.



ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE MESSAGE

The ACC meeting is held the first Wednesday of every month. Any architectural changes or improvements to the exterior of your property require approval from the ACC Committee before work can be initiated.

All ACC Change Applications must be submitted to The Farm Barn by Thursday, July 27, 2023.

Section 3.1 - General Information

Every owner shall be responsibile for maintaining and repairing the exterior of their home at their expense. This would include sheds, carports, garages, patios, paint, trim, caulking, roof repairs, structural repairs, and all other exterior maintenance.

Projects such as landscaping, buildings, fences, walls or other structures which are proposed to be placed on property within the community must have committee approval before the project starts.

Section 3.2 - ACC Approvals

All plans and material information must be submitted on an ACC Change Application, identified with the name, present address, telephone number and include the phase and lot number of the property.

Defensible Space is your property's front line defense against wildfire. Creating and maintaining defensible space around your home can dramatically increase your home's chance of surviving a wildfire and improves the safety of firefighters defending your property.

100 feet of defensible space is required by law.*

TWO ZONES MAKE UP THE REQUIRED 100 FEET OF DEFENSIBLE SPACE:

ZONE 1: 30 feet of Lean, Clean & Green

- Remove all dead plants, grass and weeds.
- 2 Remove dead or dry leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof and rain gutters.
- **3** Keep tree branches 10 feet away from your chimney and other trees.

ZONE 2: 30–100 feet of Reduced Fuel

- 4 Cut or mow annual grass down to a maximum height of 4 inches.
- **5** Create horizontal spacing between shrubs and trees.
- 6 Create vertical spacing between grass, shrubs and trees.

Use Equipment Properly to Keep from Sparking a Wildfire

7 Mow before 10 a.m., and never on a hot or windy day. String trimmers are a safer option (vs. lawnmowers) for clearing vegetation.



VERTICAL SPACING

Large trees do not have to be cut and removed as long as all of the plants beneath them are removed. This eliminates a vertical "fire ladder."



HORIZONTAL SPACING

Create horizontal and vertical spacing between plants, the amount of spacing will depend on how steep the slope is and the size of the plants.
