MOTIONED: EA/PB: To approve the location for the two little libraries built by Girl Scout Troop 2501. One little library will be installed at the Farm Barn and the second little library will be installed at Millers' Mill near the bench for Tina and Cliff Miller. M/C

INFORMATION: All Farm residents are invited to Coffee Klatsch held every Tuesday at the Farm Barn at 9 am.

INFORMATION: The two homes of the month are The Freund Family at 33834 The Farm Road. They relocated here a few years ago from Orange County and started adding their special touch to the landscape and repainted the home. We welcome them and thank them for their pride in ownership. Our second home of the month goes to the Kitchell Family at 33552 Windmill Road. They love the rural feel and have beautifully maintained a low-water landscape. MOTIONED: ES/EM: To approve a lien according to Section 5705 of the Civil Code against parcel number 362-651-015, the Association authorizes Richardson Ober LLC to place alien to recover the delinquent amounts and any late fees, interest charges, and other collection-related amounts. M/C

INFORMATION: The treasurer's report and reserve spending information was received and reviewed. The total funds in the operating account as of July 31, 2023, was \$270,697.76 with the total funds in the reserve account at \$399,241.22 for a combined total of \$669,938.97. The Mazda truck transmission was \$3,108.24 from the reserve account. There were seven new homeowners for July. The July assessments paid were 94.4% of the membership.

INFORMATION: The maintenance report was reviewed. Weed abatement and the pond algae are ongoing maintenance at this time. The pool pump at Pool #2 was replaced.

DIRECTOR REPORT

President Dave Kentish - FERT Committee Liaison

Dave reported the Farm Emergency Response Team (FERT) is here to help before any services might be available. The committee has been building resources for several years. They are equipped with ham radios. Farm residents may be on their own for 24-48 hours in the event of an emergency. Triage will be set up at Millers' Mill if needed with the team on standby. FERT meetings are held on the second Tuesday of the month at 6 p.m. at the Farm Barn. We encourage Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training through the city or county.

Vice President Paul Bakeman - Garden and RV Liaison

Paul reported there are five garden spaces available. There are 25 RV spaces available of various lengths. The 10' spaces are available as a second space for an additional \$40 rental. The same rules apply.

Corporate Secretary Michael Leonardi - Welcome Committee Liaison and Line Dancing

Michael reported the Welcome Committee visited seven homes that closed escrow in July. The staff is working hard and doing well. Line Dancing is every Tuesday and is taught by Terry Leonardi.

Treasurer Eileen San Giovanni - ACC Committee and Gazette Liaison and Exercise

Eileen reported our accounting department is in full swing working on the 2024 FPOA Budget. In the next few weeks, the Board with some of the staff will be viewing all the FPOA properties for our Reserve Study. The Reserve Study measures the life span of all buildings, pools, equipment, etc.

The Gazette Committee is finishing up the Gazette for September. Remember to check out the front cover and calendar for monthly events.

Director Edward Ahner - Maintenance Liaison

Ed Ahner reported the maintenance team is constantly working on weed abatement with safety as a top priority. Algae at the ponds is also a work in progress for the maintenance team.

Director Edward Moore - Recreation Committee Liaison

Edward Moore reported for the Recreation Committee. Meetings are held on the first Monday of each month in the Farm Barn at 6:30 p.m., except for this September's meeting to be held on the second Monday, September 11th because of Labor Day. Volunteers and guests are encouraged to attend. Planning for the forthcoming events is ongoing. They can always use a few more volunteers for their events. The next event will be Music at the Pond: on August 19th from 5:30-8:30 p.m. A FREE event, just bring your chairs and food. There will be a singer/DJ named Alyse.

The next dinner event is a luau-themed dinner on Saturday, September 16th at Millers' Mill. The menu is pulled pork sandwiches, coleslaw, pineapple slices, and dessert. You can bring your own beer or wine. Bingo will be played and a drawing will be held for excellent prizes. Donations are \$8 per reservation, \$4 for ages 3-8, and paid cash at the event. Social hour is 5 p.m. and dinner is served at \$6 p.m. Sign-ups will open on Friday, September 1st.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE MESSAGE

The ACC meeting is held the first Wednesday of every month. Any architectural changes or improvements to the exterior of your property require approval from the ACC Committee before work can be initiated.

All ACC Change Applications must be submitted to The Farm Barn by Thursday, October 26, 2023.

ACC Rule Section 6.6 Weed Abatment

Vegetation that is flammable and endangers the public safety by creating a fire hazard inlcuding but not limited to seasonal and recurrent weeds, stubble, brush, dry leaves, and tumbleweeds must be kept cleared (disked or removed) away from all structures for a distance of 100 feet or as applicable depending on lot size.

Dry pine needles are a jire hazard. Please clean them up as soon as possible.

PET OF THE MONTH

Our local animal shelters (Animal Friends of the Valley in Lake Elsinore, Ramona Animal Shelter in San Jacinto...basically, all our animal shelters) are overrun with dogs (and cats) and are having to euthanize some of them to make room. (Very sad!) Often there's a rescue group that's willing to "pull" an animal but they need a foster to keep it until it's adopted OR they need a person to go pick up the dog/cat from the shelter and take it to the foster. If they don't get those two bases covered, that animal may not make it out of the shelter. Please, Spay/Neuter your pets!

Local Transports: To transport dogs/cats from the animal shelters to a foster or rescue group, all it takes on your part is a little time and a little gas! Boy, does it ever feel great to know that you were part of saving a dog's/cat's life! Contact Lina Leslie on Facebook if you're interested in helping in either area. Lina does volunteer transport coordination for shelters and rescues.

Cross Country Transport "Legs": There are several organizations who use volunteers to transport dogs/cats across state lines (free to the receiver). They map out a route from start to finish and divide the trip up into "legs" that are 1 to 1-1/2 hours long. Volunteers sign up to drive a leg (or two) in their area and, when all the legs are filled, the dog is transported over a specific weekend. It's a little like a relay race...you meet someone in a town and transfer the dog and paperwork from car to car to car until it reaches its destination. Most dogs have either been adopted or are going to a rescue in a different state where shelter overpopulation isn't such a problem. One such organization is "Big Rig Animal Transport BRAT". Check them out if you're interested!

Fosters: You can sign up with different rescue groups to volunteer to foster dogs/cats. ("Labradors and Friends" for dogs and "Guardian Angel Rescue" for cats are a couple.) The dog/cat stays at your home, you treat it as your own, love and care for it and teach it proper manners (if needed). The rescue group pays for the veterinarian, any required medications and the food. The dog/cat does NOT belong to you...it is up for adoption. But if you happen to fall in love (like I did), you are first in line to adopt it. Meet sweet Cindy Bear! 11 years old...pulled from shelter a week ago, days before being euthanized. She's a sweetheart and we already love her!

You can also volunteer for events or fundraising with The Rescue World (for cats) at contact@therescueworld. org. These are ways you can help save animals without the responsibility of "owning" them. I've now transported 16 dogs and 1 cat. And I gotta say, it feels GREAT!!!

Saving one dog will not change the world. But for that one dog, the world is forever changed.

Defensible Space is your property's front line defense against wildfire. Creating and maintaining defensible space around your home can dramatically increase your home's chance of surviving a wildfire and improves the safety of firefighters defending your property. 100 feet of defensible space is required by law.*

TWO ZONES MAKE UP THE REQUIRED 100 FEET OF DEFENSIBLE SPACE:

ZONE 1: 30 feet of Lean, Clean & Green

- Remove all dead plants, grass and weeds.
- 2 Remove dead or dry leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof and rain gutters.
- 3 Keep tree branches 10 feet away from your chimney and other trees.

ZONE 2: 30-100 feet of Reduced Fuel

- Cut or mow annual grass down to a maximum height of 4 inches.
- 5 Create horizontal spacing between shrubs and trees.
- **6** Create vertical spacing between grass, shrubs and trees.

Use Equipment Properly to Keep from Sparking a Wildfire

Mow before 10 a.m., and never on a hot or windy day. String trimmers are a safer option (vs. lawnmowers) for clearing vegetation.



VERTICAL SPACING

Large trees do not have to be cut and removed as long as all of the plants beneath them are removed. This eliminates a vertical "fire ladder."



HORIZONTAL SPACING

Create horizontal and vertical spacing between plants, the amount of spacing will depend on how steep the slope is and the size of the plants.

OUR BLOOD BANKS ARE EXPERIENCING A SEVERE SHORTAGE OF BLOOD! PLEASE HELP!

Here are some guick ways to help make your donation successful:

Eat Up!

Iron and Vitamin C: Combining foods rich in iron and Vitamin C will boost your body's strength. Think green veggies and citrus fruits.

Salty snacks: A healthy amount of salty snacks can help make your next blood donation a positive experience and ensure that your gift will be put to use helping save one or more lives! Pretzels, anyone? **But don't skip meals:** Think of blood donation as a normal part of your day. Don't skip or add meals to your

normal routine. Just add in some healthy snacks.

Drink Up!

Hydration is important before and after your donation. When you donate blood, you give a pint of blood at a time and almost half of this is water. The more water you drink the easier your blood moves through your body and the quicker you can replace the pint you gave!

Get Moving!

In the moments before and during your donation do some simple flexing or tension exercises. Start with your toes and work your way up by tensing the muscles in your arms, legs or core for a few seconds, then relax. These simple moves will keep your blood moving for a relaxing donation! **Now you are ready to be a lifesaver!**

You can donate if:

You have tattoos and piercings

You've had recent vaccinations/immunizations

You have Heart and Lung issues or a Pacemaker

Things that may disqualify you from donating:

Currently sick (in the last 48 hours) or around people with COVID-19 (last 10 days)

Low iron

Currently Pregnant

Extremely low (90/50) or high (180/100) blood pressure

Currently have any form of cancer

Whole Blood Donors (takes about 1 hour):

Can donate every 8 weeks. Volunteers must be at least 15 years old (no maximum age), weigh at least 110 pounds and be in general good health.

Apheresis (Double) Donors (takes about 1-1/2 hours):

This process collects whole blood and isolates double red cells, platelets and plasma, then returns the remaining components (along with a saline solution) back to the donor.

Blood Donation For Teenagers:

Our young donors are vitally important to the future of blood donation. All **15- and 16-year-olds** require parental consent prior to donating. Studies have shown blood donation to be safe for our youngest "heroes," and LifeStream wants to ensure their continued health and well-being.

Did you know? With LifeStream *ExpressPass* you can speed up your donation process by completing the required pre-donation reading and health history questions *before* arriving at the donation site (must be done the day of donation-not before). Go to Lstream.org to fill out your ExpressPass.







MEDICAL EQUIPMENT
