### **AGENDA ITEMS**

INFORMATION: Michael Leonardi discussed having the Coffee Klatsch return to the Farm Barn on Tuesdays at 9 a.m. for coffee, tea, and snacks. He asked if anyone was willing to volunteer. With no volunteers speaking up, Michael and Eileen volunteered to get it started. The first Coffee Klatsch will be held on Tuesday, August 1st at 9 am at the Farm Barn.

INFORMATION: The two ACC Homes of the Month for July were announced. The Cisneros family at 34130 Harvest Way moved to The Farm in November 2018. They so enjoy all the amenities that the Farm offers. They have painted the home inside and out. It's such a wonderful example of pride in ownership.

The second home is the Hoffman family at 34582 The Farm Road. They have been loving the Farm since 2012. They enjoy the peaceful quietness and the feeling of a semi-rural environment. They have beautiful roses and geraniums. This year they have been in full bloom. Thank you for showing such pride in ownership.

MOTIONED: ES/PB: To approve a lien according to Section 5705 of the Civil Code against parcel number 362-311-003, the Association authorizes Richardson Ober LLC to place a lien to recover the delinquent amounts and any late fees, interest charges, and other collection-related amounts. M/C

INFORMATION: The treasurer's report and reserve spending information was received and reviewed. The total funds in the operating account as of June 30, 2023, was \$247,782.45 with the total funds in the reserve account at \$397,281.11 for a combined total of \$645,063.56. The possible draws from the reserve account this year are expected to total \$57,578.00. There were 10 new homeowners for June.

INFORMATION: The maintenance report was received and reviewed. One-third of the weed abatement has been completed. Weed abatement is still ongoing throughout the Farm. There has been vandalism at the pools and also a broken mirror in the men's restroom at one of the pools.

### **DIRECTOR REPORT**

### President Dave Kentish - FERT Committee Liaison

Dave reported FERT is here to maintain a presence at the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) near RV3 with communications established and available to reach Riverside County emergency assistance in the event of a local fire or major earthquake. They are ready to respond. There was no meeting for July. Training is completed once a month when available.

### Vice President Paul Bakeman - Garden and RV Liaison

Paul reported there are still 23 or 24 RV spaces available ranging in size from 10' to 40'. There is a key deposit of \$20 and a \$40 per month rental fee this year.

There are four garden spaces available with a \$20 key deposit. No charge for the water. We currently have 12 spaces being used. Friendly reminder to maintain the garden space and keep it weed-free.

### Corporate Secretary Michael Leonardi - Welcome Committee Liaison and Line Dancing

Michael reported the Welcome Committee is back. Clarice and Terry visited 25 homes in an attempt to visit new homeowners for April, May, and June. Out of the 25 homes, six visits were successful, eight properties had no access, two were vacant and nine homes were left a wonderful packet full of information. Michael reminded everyone in attendance that every Tuesday is line dancing at Millers' Mill beginning at 6 pm and it's a lot of fun.

### Treasurer Eileen San Giovanni - ACC Committee and Gazette Liaison and Exercise

We have two new members joining our morning exercise class. Gayl and Sally have been a great addition to the group. We continue to meet Monday-Thursday from 7:15 am to 7:45 am at Millers' Mill.

The Gazette delivery team is doing a great job. All routes have delivery volunteers. Please check out all the exciting events coming up in the next few months.

Our accounting department is running smoothly as ever. Melissa will be starting to put together the 2024 budget. The committees will be working on their budgets at their August meetings.

### Director Edward Ahner - Maintenance Liaison

Ed Ahner reported the maintenance team is constantly working on weed abatement with safety as a top priority. Algae at the ponds is also a work in progress for the maintenance team.

### Director Edward Moore - Recreation Committee Liaison

Edward Moore reported for the Recreation Committee. Meetings are held on the first Monday of each month in the Farm Barn at 6:30 pm. The next regular meeting is Monday, August 7th. Volunteers and guests are encouraged to attend. Planning for the forthcoming events is ongoing. They can always use a few more volunteers for their events.

Both the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade and the hot dog barbecue meal were well attended. The parade had many last-minute sign-ups, but the registration was well organized by Denice. As with the Halloween event, candy did not last the entire route, but was well received.

### SoCalGas will be in your neighborhood soon for a pipeline enhancement project.

We will be replacing a section of our natural gas pipelines with new pipe. Excavations will be made in the street and possibly on your property where the service lines run to the gas meter for your home. Our construction crew will do their best to not disturb your property.

There is the possibility your natural gas may be shut off while the work is being performed. We anticipate that this would only take a few hours. Once the pipeline work is completed, an adult is required to be present for the natural gas services to be restored. If you are not available once repairs are complete to turn your service on, please schedule a time for a service technician to return by calling SoCalGas at 1-800-427-2200 at any time.

### FIRE EXTINGUISHER BASICS

Howdy farmers! This month, the FERT committee would like to talk to you about fire extinguishers: the most common types, uses, and some thoughts on general fire safety.

There are 5 types of fire extinguishers, and they are each designed for a specific job and type of fire. For the sake of clarity, we are going to focus on the two types most often found in the home and readily available.

The first is the dry powder type, often called an ABC extinguisher, as it will put out the first three classes of fires. Class A: wood, paper, and plastics, etc.; Class B: flammable liquids, like paints and solvents; and Class C: electrical fires. This versatile type will handle most situations in, and around, your home with the exception of grease and oil fires in the kitchen. This is where the type K extinguishers come in, to put out type K fires (think k for kitchen, simple right?) Now, let's talk about storage. While a bright, red extinguisher might not go with every décor, it's important that it can be found when needed. Most fire extinguishers come with some type of wall mounting system, and using this mount will ensure the extinguisher's location is always the same to be easily found and accessed. It is suggested that you have at least 2 extinguishers in the home, in different locations, to always provide access to one of them safely, no matter where the fire may be.

So, you have the extinguisher, now here's how you use it. Think of the acronym PASS: P-pull the ring pin, on many extinguishers there is a plastic band that holds the ring pin in place, that will break as you pull the pin; A-aim the nozzle at the base of the fire; S-squeeze the handle to discharge the extinguisher at the base of the fire, shooting the flames will not put the fire out; and the last S-sweep, discharge the extinguisher in a sweeping motion, back and forth, across the base of the fire.

That's the very basics of operation, but there is always more to know! Not just about fire safety, but all aspects of emergency readiness. If you are interested in learning more, the Farm Emergency Response Team (FERT) meets the first Tuesday of every month at 6 o'clock in the Farm Barn Library.
