### **ACC Committee**

Cliff Vosburg reported for Coffee Klatsch. We had a great turn out. There was no fooling at our last Coffee Klatsch held on Monday, April 1<sup>st</sup>. Fresh oranges, biscotti and other treats were provided. We meet at the Farm Barn library at 9:15 a.m. on the first Monday of every month.

### **Community Garden**

Beth Kramer reported for the Garden Committee. Happy April! Our March meeting was fruitful. We discussed getting soil amendment for the community beds, and the seed catalogs are in. We got seeds donated from Kathy Bradley, and an anonymous donor of more bricks. We discussed the concerns of the RV 2 lot being placed within the community garden area. Thank you to Mary and Morgan for attending our last meeting. We started our chair nominations from the committee and will be meeting and voting at our next meeting on Monday, May 20<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. Thanks to the garage sale we have a wheel barrel that just needs a new tire. That is will less expensive than a new one all the way around.

## **Crime Watch Committee**

Cathy Neubauer reported for Crime Watch. There were 14 patrols totaling 28.25 hours with 250 miles driven. The financials were reviewed and approved. Crime Watch is still in need of members and patrols. An increase in negative activity in the neighborhood was discussed. If you or anyone you know have been victimized please call and report it no matter how minor it may be. This will keep our deputies aware of the need for patrols in our area.

New election chairs for the committee are coming up. Encourage your neighbors or if you want to be one of those on the committee please run. Get your nominations in by May so it can be voted on in June and take seat in July.

Next meeting is Monday, April 22 at 7:00 p.m. at Millers' Mill. The next Meet and Greet is Saturday, May 11<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. at the Farm Barn. This is a guest speaker event. The next meeting will be held on Monday, May 20<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at Millers' Mill.

### **FERT Committee**

Dean Gray reported for the FERT Committee. In the combined areas of operations, logistics, planning and administrative, the following are approximate numbers to date. With focus on the following critical areas: Administrative Team-Leadership currently operating at approximately 90%, (still looking for a Search and Rescue replacement); Block Captains currently operating at approximately 20%, we are still in need of more Block captains; medical supplies currently operating at 15%; Search and Rescue equipment at approximately 10%; security equipment at approximately 20% (seven detour signs have been purchased); and food storage at approximately 15%, up 5% with donations. The FERT Operations Building is fully operational with the new generator in place; communications are running at approximately 95%. No change.

Our quarterly drill was conducted on Wednesday, March 27<sup>th</sup>. This was to test all of FERT's equipment, radios, generator, and all other equipment with an earthquake scenario. This was an initial evaluation of possible damage to the Farm, the FERT team, along with block captains and Crime Watch evaluated the Farm to report damages to the IC within 50 minutes of initial report. All equipment operated at 100%. Our next drill is Sunday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>. Our quarterly blood drive will be this Saturday from 8am to 1pm at Millers' Mill.

## **Recreation Committee**

Eileen San Giovanni reported for the Recreation Committee. The April 6<sup>th</sup> Community Garage Sale was a huge success! We couldn't have asked for better weather. The Recreation Committee wants to thank our talented Liaison Morgan Dulak for compiling the garage sale lists which included a map on the reverse side. It was very useful for our residents and guests. There were plenty of great bargains to choose from. With that I found some super additions for our December Christmas Polar Express extravaganza.

### WEST NILE VIRUS PREVENTION

Attention ALL Farm Residents! As you have probably read in the paper or seen in the news, mosquitoes that carry West Nile Virus have reached epidemic proportions in Riverside County. Also, the arrival of nonnative mosquitoes that carry Yellow Fever was discovered a while back.

There are ways to avoid mosquito bites that have been frequently recommended in the news, including wearing long pants and long sleeves when outside, using mosquito repellent containing DEET, and avoiding being outside at dusk or dawn when mosquitoes are most active. These are all good ideas.

However, the best way to deal with disease carrying mosquitoes is to prevent them from breeding in the first place. Mosquitoes can breed in as little as a discarded bottle cap full of water!

Farm residents! We strongly request that you check your yards for anything that may catch and hold standing water. We ask that you do this frequently and regularly, especially after watering or after a rain.

Look for buckets; open coolers; cans; plant pots; trash cans; pools; bird baths; old tires; anything that can hold even a small amount of standing water. Dump them and discard them, bring them inside or turn them so they won't collect water. Remember, even something as small as a bottle cap full of water can breed mosquitoes.

The frequent rains this winter and spring will create a lot of potential standing water, but being vigilant concerning standing water should be a year around project.

Remember also that mosquitoes don't respect fence lines. You following these simple guidelines regularly, now and in the future, will not only protect you and your family but it will also protect your neighbors as well.

Be a good neighbor. Let's all work together and keep our community a safe place to live.

Most of you have heard of "Crime Watch", but do you really know what the intent of this FPOA committee is? Crime Watch is made up of residents of the Farm who volunteer their time for YOU. It exists to assist local law enforcement organizations in deterring crime throughout The Farm. The duties of the Crime Watch Committee members are to observe and report all unusual circumstances within the Farm. In years past, the group was made up of approximately 80 residents. Over time, our volunteer pool has dwindled considerably and we are once again asking for more volunteers so that we can still make a difference; and we do!

It's very easy to say, "Oh, but they can't **do** anything, what's the point?" Crime Watch is not responsible for policing the community; the Sheriff's Department polices the community. Crime Watch (an FPOA Sanctioned group), as well as a Neighborhood Watch group (non-sanctioned group), assists them with this by being a **visible presence**, in addition to the members' eyes and ears on our neighborhood. When ne'er-do-wells come into our area with decided mischief and larceny on their minds, the Crime Watch car and the members manning it, have a definite impact on their thought processes. More volunteers mean more patrols and more coverage of our neighborhood; give a couple of hours a week or month, whatever time you can spare - make a difference in **YOUR** community.

Every 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday we have an Informational Meeting at 9:00 a.m. at the Farm Barn, coffee and donuts are served; and our **Committee**Regular meeting is the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of every month at 7:00 p.m. at Millers Mill. Come and join us and see what is happening in your community or update us with information you might have.

If you don't have time to volunteer for Crime Watch, then make a point of getting to know your neighbors, exchange your name, address and other pertinent details with them, (see sample card below). Be alert and aware of what's happening around you – we're in this together.

## **7 Beneficial Garden Insects**

### 1. Ladybug

**Preys**: aphids, whitefly, mites, fleas, Colorado potato beetle **Attracted by**: Dill, Dandelion, Fern-leaf Yellow, Basket of Gold, Common Yarrow

**Facts**: Ladybugs can consume more than 5,000 aphids during their lifetime.

**Facts**: Braconid wasps kills hornworms by laying eggs inside the caterpillar.

### 5. Damsel Bugs

**Preys**: caterpillars, mites, aphids, potato beetles, cabbage worms **Attracted by**: Caraway, Fennel, Alfalfa, Spearmint, Peter Pan Goldenrod

**Facts**: damsel bug populations can thrive if you provide them alternative places to hide.

### 6. Green Lacewings

**Preys**: aphids, whitefly, leafhopper, mealybugs, caterpillars of pest moths

**Attracted by:** Dill, Angelica, Golden Marguerite, Coriander, Dandelion **Facts**: the larvae does the actual job of getting rid of soft-bodied

## 7. Minute Pirate Bugs

**Preys**: spider mites, insect eggs, caterpillars, aphids, thrips **Attracted by**: Caraway, Fennel, Alfalfa, Spearmint, Peter Pan Goldenrod






