### **Architectural Control Committee Message:**

In July ACC evaluations will resume, we will be checking for weeds, paint, landscaping, storage and other violations that need to be cleaned up as well. The Quarterly Evaluation Process is as follows: 1) The owners of any properties found to be in non-compliance will receive a 2-week courtesy letter. 2) The owners of the properties that are still in non-compliance after being checked following the deadline will receive a 10-day Notice of Hearing. A 72-hour notice if attending the executive meeting must be received in the office. 3) If the owners of the properties are still in non-compliance after being checked a third time, the Board may consider assessing a fine. At this point, a letter notifying the owner of the fine is mailed out. We know this has been a trying time for many, we must all work together to maintain our community, stay safe and healthy!


### 1st Quarter - Compliance Evaluation Statistics

During our first ACC evaluation of the year, the Architectural Control Committee determined that 257 properties were found to be in violation of the FPOA Architectural rules. After the initial inspection, those 257 properties were sent a first notice (2-week courtesy letter) to encourage homeowners to correct the violations. Two weeks later a second inspection occurred in order to determine how many properties corrected their violations. Out of the original 257 violations, 151 violations were corrected, leaving 106 violations that remained in a non-compliant status. A second and final notice was then sent out giving residents ten days to correct their violation before fines are assessed to owner accounts. After ten days, the final inspection took place and showed that 55 out of the 106 violations were corrected; leaving only 51 violations total. Below is a visual representation of the information we collected - post evaluation.

# Rec. Vehicle Screening Requirements

RV'S Must be parked (50) feet from the curb or screened from street view.



### **Unlawful Street Parking**

Wildomar City Municipal Code 10.20.020, states a vehicle or trailer parked or left standing at the same location for more than 72 hours is prohibited to be parked or left standing at another location within 500 feet from the original location. If Code Enforcement marks the vehicle 72 hours later it will be towed by the Sheriff's Department. Residents can call or email Code Enforcement to report unattended trailers, vehicles, or other suspicious items. Code Enforcement also accepts reports of violations or concerns on the city of Wildomar website along with a full staff directory.
