"YUMMY FOR THE TUMMY"

#### **EGG NOG MINI LOAVES**

Submitted by Jane Merrow

Preheat oven to 350 F. - Bake 30 to 35 minutes

In a large bowl combine....2 1/4 cups flour -2 tsp. baking powder  $-\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. salt  $-\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. cinnamon  $-\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. nutmeg.

In another large bowl...Beat...2 eggs - 1 cup sugar - 1 cup eggnog - ½ cup melted butter - 2 tsp. vanilla - 2 tsp. rum extract. Combine wet and dry ingredients just until moistened.

Pour into three greased 5 3/4 inch X 3 inch, X 2 inch loaf pans. Bake at 350 for 30 to 35 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool 10 minutes before removing from ant to wire rack.

Yield: 3 loaves

This recipe was tested with commercially prepared eggnog.



## THE COMPLETION OF WHAT WAS A LABOR OF LOVE

So here is the wrap-up of what I said I would provide for this month written in the first person in 2012. "Since we last spoke" I went on vacation and came back to find the following progress on my favorite project, you all know what that is. Just before my departure the FPOA President, our Maintenance Manager, and I met at Millers' Mill and did what you would do if you bought a new home, and what our maintenance manager will do every time we rent the facility to one of our members. We did a job walk. It is time to do that because we are so close to the finish line that we can taste it. And we need to be sure that all is ready for the final inspections to complete the project. First, we walked around the outside and then went inside. Our goal was to admire what was done and to identify all of the remaining tasks that need to be completed before we call for our Fire and Final Inspections.

As an aside, my philosophy is now and always has been for all of the FPOA Projects I have completed for the FPOA, "Make sure that all of the "I"s were dotted and the "T"s were crossed, because every time that an inspector has to come back to re-inspect what we should have done but didn't do, costs extra money that may not be in the budget. I have always liked getting back part of the original deposit fee we had to give to the City because the inspector didn't have to come back.

Not to toot my own horn but throughout my volunteer work here, I have never had a re-inspection and always got a little of our money back.

To go on, part of the following is what is known as a punch list and we developed a rather long one. To satisfy the Fire Department, we still need to install the Fire Lane Signs along the access roadway that runs between the Maintenance Shop and the Millers' Mill Building.

In addition, we have a requirement to place "No Parking" Signs in the required Fire Engine "turn around" at the end of the access roadway. These signs have been ordered for installation but are still not on hand. Please know that the Fire Department does not like gravel surfaces for building access, [Fire Trucks are Heavy], however, we have prepared the road surface following the required compaction as dictated by the Geotechnical Study. Now, all we need to do is to get approval to surface it with gravel.

Another requirement that we have identified is the required "KNOX BOX" to by the yellow-colored swing gate. We have the box, just need to install it. We still need to obtain and install the required 12-inch tall numbers that will identify the building address, they are being made, and we will put them high at the Northwest corner to be conspicuous as possible for entry into the area. For your information, the building address will be 33379-B Millpond Road. We have installed a white plastic two rail fence between the aforementioned roadway and the building, also around the rip-rap area where the disabled parking is planned.

To date, we have passed our Landscape Irrigation Inspection, putting in drought-resistant plantings as is required. We plan to cover the planter areas around the building with red-colored bark mulch. We have placed the Electrical Load Center near the Northwest corner and have satisfied our electrical load calculation requirement, but still need to identify each circuit breaker in the box following The National Electrical Code, Uniform Building Code (UBC) & in compliance with NFPA 70 [The National Fire Protection Act].

These documents further state that we must identify these circuit breakers for what they serve. The listing will include all of the wall outlets, all lighting, the two air handlers inside and the air compressors outside, and ceiling fans. Other items to be completed are the Handicap wheel stops and Disabled Parking Signs, Locks for the Load Center, and containment for the 124 Gallon Propane tank for the kitchen hot water.

Inside the building, we still have a lot of work to finish up. We have to install the 5-pound fire extinguishers but need the fire inspector to determine where to place them. [There is a 75 ft. rule, I am told]. We need to purchase and install the building occupant signs that will indicate 199 person capacity. We are required to place one above each end door to the facility. Weatherstripping around the doors. I noticed that the required panic bars are installed on the doors and the two ADA drinking fountains are in place.


The required "See Through" Door between the Serving Kitchen and the main room has been installed as required. All of the pneumatic door closers are in place and adjusted. There is the planned multiple Light / Fan Switch installed by the East Entrance door but needs to be labeled. Maintenance has installed an HVAC Timer switch near the men's restroom that will control the time of use when the building is to be occupied. When all of the ADA requirements have been met, our Maintenance crew has done a professional and miraculous job making and installing all of the interior carpentry work, all that is left after these miscellaneous items are taken care of is to seal and buff the floor. We are so close, I can't wait till we can let all of us in. Hopefully, by the time my next article comes around, we all will be enjoying the fruits of this labor of love we have been able to finally accomplish.

So there you have it. It was a long time coming and one can't believe all of the hoops that a construction project jumps through to create what you see as a finished product. However, you now have some inkling of what it takes to offer you a Saturday Night dinner get-together.

Just when that will be possible again depends on the Pandemic we presently face. I hope we can get back to the enjoyment of what we had with all of our friends before we forget who they all are.

The rest of the Millers' Mill story is history.
