At the April 14th Open Meeting, the Board of Directors decided due to the increased cost of natural gas Pool 2 will be heated to 78 degrees like the other pools. Please keep in mind that the budget is always voted in the previous year and even though a 2% increase was planned it was not enough to cover the unexpected high increase in the cost. In year's past, Pool 2 was heated to 84 degrees.

The pool schedule is listed at the bottom on the Board's message for review.

For Pool 1 and Pool 3 the standard schedule will remain with the heating of the pools beginning June 1, 2022. Pool 1 is the pool on Farm Road and Pool 3 is the pool located on Wagon Train.







JIFFY FRUIT SALAD

1 can peach pie filling

1 can pineapple chunks

1 can Mandarin oranges

1 cup minature marshmallows

2 bananas (sliced)

Mix above ingredients. Add any other fruit or melon that is in season, such as: strawberries, rasberries, cantaloupe, watermelon, or grapes. Just before serving slice 2 bananas into the mixture. This is a good salad for potlucks or picnics. Serves 10.

7 LAYER SALAD

2 cups shredded lettuce

½ cup chopped celery

½ cup chopped green pepper

½ cup chopped onion

1 pkg. frozen peas, thawed

1 pt. mayo or salad dressing

1 tbsp. sugar

2-4 oz. shredded cheese or Parmesan cheese

8 strips of bacon, fried

Layer an 8½ x 11½ inch glass baking dish with 1 inch of lettuce. Continue layering the next 5 ingredients. Sprinkle on the sugar and the cheese. Crumble the bacon over the top. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate 8 to 24 hours. Note: You may vary the amounts of vegetables according to taste.





Blue Light and Aging - Blue light from screens may accelerate aging. Fruit flies exposed to 12 hours of blue light and 12 hours of darkness lived significantly shorter lives that those kept in total darkness or exposed to light with blue waves-lenghts filtered out. Blue light-exposed flies had damage retinal cells and brain neurons. Human blue light exposure is increasing quickly through widespread use of LED lighting and electronic devices. *Study by researchers at Oregon State University, Corvallis, published un Aging and Mechanisms of Disease.*

Psoriasis Alert - Psoriasis increases risk for may types of cancer by an average of 18%. Esophageal, liver, pancreatic and squamous cell skin cancers were among the highest risks. The exact link is unclear but could be related to inflammation. Consistent cancer screenings can help with early detection and diagnosis. *Alex M. Trafford, MSc, is a PhD candidate in the department of biology, medicine and health at University of Manchester in the UK and lead author of a study published in JAMA Dermatology.*

Less Calories, Better Health - Cutting just 300 calories per day improves health. Recent study: Normal-weight adults who ate 300 fewer calories daily for six months significantly reduced their levels of cholesterol, triglycerides, blood pressure and blood sugar. After two years, those who continued the reduced-calorie diet experiences a drop in chronic inflammation linked to heart disease, cancer and dementia. *Takeaway:* Skipping one daily snack of a few cookies, a scoop of ice cream or some potato chips could reduce your risk for heart disease, diabetes and cancer. *William E. Kraus, MD, distinguished professor of medicine, Duke University School of Medicine, Durham, North Carolina.*


